

## YOUTH APPRENTICE PROGRAM

MSW employed two youth apprentices this last year and is proud to announce that both were accepted into the universities of their choice. Ollie is attending Marquette University pursuing a dental degree, and Tori is attending the University of Minnesota pursuing a dental hygiene degree. The state-wide Youth Apprentice program is a partnership between the Department of Workforce Development and area high schools in which apprentices are hired by local employers to gain career experience that go above and beyond what students learn in the classroom.

Oral health is an integral part of our well-being and oral hygiene plays a big part in keeping our

mouths healthy. In an effort to promote and support oral health care, MSW distributes oral health supplies to communities in need. This year, one group that MSW was able to support was the resident families of Bayview by providing some oral health supplies for their families.

By providing essential dental care products we can help empower individuals to take charge of their oral health. The positive impact on communities is evident through improved hygiene, prevention of dental diseases, enhanced quality of life, and

economic benefits. Basic oral hygiene

products such as toothbrushes, toothpaste and floss help ensure that everyone,

regardless of their location or socioeconomic status, has access to the supplies needed for a healthy smile.

**\$50** provides a patient with 1-year of oral health supplies for use at Home

**\$100** covers the cost of an emergency visit and x-rays

**\$500** provides preventative care for 10 people

**\$1,000** covers the cost of a tooth-saving crown versus a permanent loss
